District Doings and News

The club is participating in the District’s second Art for Peace Contest, in partnership with local family shelters (specifically HIS-OC). A winner will be selected for three (3) age groups (under 12, teens, and adults) in mid-October, who will then move on to the District level.

Last week’s Program**Katie Savant - CSUF Director of Local & Community Relations**

Katie has had a varied career, working with the military families, the City of Glendora, and others - all of which led her in 2018 to her current position with CSUF.

41,000 students attend CSUF, a high percentage of which are first in their families to seek higher education, and CSUF is #1 in the State awarding degrees and scholarships to Hispanics and women. CSUF employs 8700 persons, and annually pays \$65 million in state tax revenues.

New sports facility developments on campus include a new NCAA softball field and a 15-meter competition pool (to be utilized by women sports and water polo teams).

The school currently provides on-campus housing to 2200; 600 new student housing units are underway. A new engineering & computer science innovation hub is planned for completion in 2028/29. An exciting addition is the Gateway steel and concrete pedestrian bridge over Nutwood, connecting the north and south campus. The Gateway will accommodate 10,000 crossings daily. The cost is estimated at \$12-15M; federal and local funding is being sought.
