Previous Week's Program

Sheila Rodriguez Placentia Public Safety Communications

Sheila (Shay) is the Public Safety
Dispatcher for the City of Placentia, and
will shortly be inducted as a member of
our Rotary club. She has been with the
City for 3 years, with prior dispatching
responsibilities for a few other cities.
She earned her BS at CalPoly Pomona and
her Master of Public Administration at
Azusa Pacific. She is a part of the
Orange County Peer Support Team.



In September 2020, a state Assembly bill established/recognized dispatchersas first responders. Shortly thereafter, the City of Placentia established its Public Safety Communications department for its police and fire & life safety departments. This group provides coverage 24/7 with its 4 teams; each team consists of 3 dispatchers and 1 supervisor, under a single manager. Current staffing includes 2 parttime dispatchers. Qualified personnel must have a high school diploma or GED, be able to type 45 words per minute, must pass peace officer standards and training (including a written exam), and is subject to a home visit/inspection/check. The

dispatchers undergo on-the-job training, and a 4-phase training regimen.

Each work shift is comprised of 4-hour windows, switching to different areas of focus. Shay showed us a slide of the work stations: 4 or more screens to be monitored and responded to appropriately, with at least 4 different program systems and situational protocols!

In OC, those needing emergency assistance or response are now able to communicate via text to 911, using simple words, no emojis or photos. Out-of-service cell phones are still able to call 911.

Shay and her department members engage in community outreach at our local events. An especially meaningful display at the station is the Tree of Life: if they are able to talk to a caller, and able to restore circulation to the victim, the dispatcher earns a LEAF; if they are able to help the caller in a birth, the dispatcher earns a BLUE FLOWER. Truly a visual representation of the positive results of their work!

Tomorrow, Thursday 2/29 is Leap Day!

During use of the Julian calendar, did not correctly calculate the Earth's rotation around the sun. In Roman Catholic countries, In 1582, Pope Gregory XIII reformed the calendar by adding what we now call Leap Day. Britain and its colonies did not begin using the Gregorian calendar for almost 200 years (in 1752).

A baby has about 1 in 1,500 of being born on February 29th, with an estimated 200,000 leap day babies in America. When does a Leap Day baby legally "have" a birthday, such as when they can get their drivers license? This depends upon which state they reside! California allows them to come of age on February 28th, rather than March 1st.
